### TOURNEY ARRANGED FOR HIGH SCHOOLS

With the thirteenth annual basketball tournament held under the auspices of Lawrence college only three weeks away, the outlook for places in the big meet is beginning to narrow down to a comparatively few teams in each section of the state. In the northeastern districts, Fond du Lac, with victories over Neenah, Ripon, West Green Bay, Appleton and Rhinelander, has a strong chance in the meet. Rinon, Appleton and Wittenberg are still in, as are Oconto, Tigerton, Algoma and Menasha. Probably this week's games will narrow the running down to a half dozen teams, three of which will be chosen from this section.

In the northwestern district, Eau Claire, Cumberland, Medford, Ladysmith, Rice Lake, and the two Superior high schools are showing up strongest, with advantages at present apparently in favor of Eau Claire and Medford.

In the southern section, the race is so close and the record so nearly alike that no predictions are as yet made as to the outcome, though Monroe, Brodhead, Columbus, Edgerton, Hillsboro, Kenosha, Stoughton, and West Bend are making the best showings to date. Lawrence officials state, however, that a number of elimination games probably will be necessary to pick the three representatives from the southern section.

### GOOD FOOD; CHEAP FOOD.

(Bulletin No. 19—Chicago II, 1910). Summing up the chief points of the present food situation, here is a showing at a glance what a good substitution for expensive foods the housewife should make use of.

**Potatoes.**  
Three hundred and seventy food units at 6 cents a pound.

**Substitutes for Potatoes.**  
White flour, 6 cents a pound; 1,665 food units.

White bread, 6 2/3 cents a pound; 1,215 food units.

Macaroni, 10 cents a pound; 1,665 food units.

Corn meal, 4 to 5 cents a pound; 1,650 food units.

Rice, 6 cents a pound; 1,620 food units.

Oatmeal, 7 or 8 cents a pound; 1,850 food units.

Bears (dried), 8 to 12 1/2 cents a pound; 1,625 food units.

Peas (dried), 12 1/2 cents a pound; 1,655 food units.

**Prices of Vegetables.**  
High cost vegetables—  
Onions, 190 food units.

Low cost vegetables—  
Soup vegetables, 5 cents a pound; 150 food units.

Apples for cooking, 4 to 5 cents a pound; 220 food units.

Bananas, 5 cents a pound; 300 food units.

Oranges, 6 to 7 cents a pound; 170 food units.

Prunes, 15 cents a pound; 1,190 food units.

Raisins, 23 cents a pound; 1,145 food units.

In Place of Butter.  
Butter, 45 to 52 cents a pound;

3,605 food units.  
Low Cost Substitutes for Butter.  
Oleomargarine and various proprietary butter substitutes—Average cost, 25 cents a pound; average food units, 3,525.

Buy the cheaper cuts of meat; they are just as nutritious as the more expensive cuts and when properly cooked are very palatable.

Porterhouse steak, 35 cents a pound; 1,070 food units.

Broiling chickens, 38 cents a pound; 290 food units.

Leg of lamb, 28 cents a pound; 740 food units.

Beef heart, 14 cents a pound; 1,160 food units.

Corned beef flank, 15 cents a pound; 1,165 food units.

Beef shank, 14 cents a pound; 545 food units.

Ox tails, 12 1/2 cents a pound; 535 food units.

The last of these are extremely useful in cooking; delicious soup, the bones supplying both gelatin and flavor. Soups are excellent, with dry foods, such as bread.
